In confirmation with University Grants Commission Regulations, 2015 the College has established a Grievance Redressal Cell, to provide a mechanism for redressal of students' grievances related to academic functioning or matters hampering the student life of the institution. The function of the cell is to look into the complaints lodged by any student, and judge its merit. Anyone with a genuine grievance may approach the department members in person, or in consultation with the officer in-charge of Grievance Redressal Cell. In case the person is unwilling to appear in self, grievances may be dropped in writing at the suggestion box of the Grievance Cell placed in adjacent to the Principals Chamber. The grievance box is opened twice a month and the cell discusses the major issues and suggestions are forwarded to the management for reconciliation but matters of grave concern and immediate redressal, communicated to the authorities are taken heed immediately. The cell was reconstituted as per the guidelines of "University Grants Commission (Redressal of Grievances of Students) Regulations, 2023," which aims to provide an effective mechanism for redressing student grievances in higher education institutions in India. A link is given in the College website to lodge complaint directly to administration. Utmost confidentiality is adhered to in receiving and reporting all grievances.

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

Program Content

- Introduction to the Grievance Redressal Cell:

 - The committee members were presented to the students, ensuring transparency and accessibility.
 - The process of filing a grievance was explained in detail.
- Student Rights and Responsibilities:
 - Students were informed about their rights, including the right to a fair hearing,
 confidentiality, and timely resolution of grievances.

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Rules and Regulations Regarding Anti- Ragging

The institution is committed to fostering a safe, inclusive, and conducive learning environment free from the menace of ragging. In accordance with the University Grants Commission (UGC) 'Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Education Institutions, 2009 and Supreme Court orders dated 08.05.2009, this policy outlines the institution's measures to prevent, prohibit, and address ragging within its premises.

Ragging: Any act or conduct, whether by words, deeds, or otherwise, that is
directed towards or affects a student or students, and which creates a hostile,
intimidating, or degrading environment or atmosphere for the student or
students, or which causes or is likely to cause physical or mental harm or injury
to the student or students.

Prohibition of Ragging

- Ragging is strictly prohibited within the college premises, hostels, or any other place connected with the college.
- Any act of ragging, whether physical, mental, or verbal, is considered a serious offense and will be dealt with severely.

Measures to Prevent Ragging

- Constitution of Anti- Ragging Committee and cell- The institution has constituted the cell as per the directions stipulated by UGC and instructions given by Mahatma Gandhi University from time to time.
- Orientation Programs: The college conducts comprehensive orientation programs for new students to familiarize them with the college's rules, regulations, and antiragging policies.
- Anti-Ragging Committees: The college has established anti-ragging committees at



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various levels, including the institutional level, faculty level, and hostel level.

- Awareness Campaigns: The college has conducted awareness campaigns and workshops, competitions to educate students, faculty, and staff about the harmful effects of ragging.
- Student Mentorship Programs: The college implements student mentorship programs to provide support and guidance to new students.
- CCTV Surveillance: The college has installed CCTV cameras in strategic locations to monitor activities and deter ragging.

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- Grievance Redressal Mechanism: A transparent grievance redressal mechanism is implemented to allow students to report incidents of ragging without fear of reprisal.
- Implementing second Amendment in UGC regulations- In compliance of the 2nd
 Amendment in UGC regulations. It has been made compulsory for each student
 and every parent to submit an online undertaking every academic year at
 www.antiragging.in

Consequences of Ragging

- Students found guilty of ragging will be subject to disciplinary action, including
 - Suspension or expulsion from the college.
 - Cancellation of admission.
 - o Fine.
 - o Other penalties as deemed appropriate by the college authorities.
- The college will also take necessary legal action against perpetrators of ragging.

Role of Students

- Students are expected to cooperate with the college authorities in preventing ragging.
- Students who witness or become aware of any acts of ragging are encouraged to report them to the appropriate authorities.

The institution is committed to providing a safe and conducive learning environment for all students. The zero tolerance anti-ragging policy framed by the institution is expected to prevent and address ragging within the institution and hostel premises. By adhering to this policy, the college aims to create a positive and inclusive campus culture.
