Decisions taken

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
Agenda 1 – As evidenced from the previous meeting, no such instances or grievances related to anti- ragging have been reported either in the institution or in the Hostel.

- **Basic Self-Defence Techniques:** Surya instructed participants on simple and effective self-defence moves to defend themselves against physical attacks.
- **Personal Safety Tips:** Valuable tips for staying safe on and off campus were shared.

Evaluation:

The workshop received positive feedback from the participants. They appreciated the practical nature of the training and felt more confident in their ability to handle themselves in potentially dangerous situations.




Main Event
